### **Dale Bauman Receives Elanco Award for Excellence in Dairy Science**

**Champaign, IL** – The American Dairy Science Association (ADSA) is pleased to announce Dale Bauman as the 2011 recipient of the Elanco Award for Excellence in Dairy Science. The award was presented on Tuesday, July 12, 2011 during the awards ceremony at the ADSA Annual Meeting in New Orleans, Louisiana.

The Elanco Award for Excellence in Dairy Science was created to recognize outstanding research in dairy production or manufacturing contributing to improvement or care of dairy cattle, development and improvement of processes, products, equipment, methods, handling, and sanitation.

Dale E. Bauman is Liberty Hyde Bailey professor in the Department of Animal Science, Cornell University, and is internationally recognized for research on the regulation of nutrient use. Co-author of over 500 scientific articles, his concepts of metabolic regulation are widely applied and have resulted in new technologies such as bovine somatotropin (bST). Bauman has also focused on functional foods with improved health benefits, including the identification of conjugated linoleic acid and vaccenic acid as naturally occurring anticarcinogens present in ruminant fat. Elected to the National Academy of Sciences, Bauman has served on the National Research Council/National Academy of Sciences (NRC/NAS) Board of Agriculture, Federation of Animal Science Societies Committee on Biotechnology, and the USDA Agricultural Biotechnology Advisory Committee.
